'Landfill Harmonic' opens CT Eco-Film Festival



SATMC calls for review of REDISA governance structures



The 2016 Budget includes steps for the replacement of the existing funding model for tyre waste management by October 1. The South African Tyre Manufacturers Conference (SATMC) said there also a need to review representation by government and the tyre manufacturing industry within the Redisa governance structures.

“The SATMC is unable to assess whether funds paid by the industry has enabled the fulfilment of the Redisa-legislated mandate and our industry’s obligation to meet certain waste tyre management and recycling obligations,” their spokesperson said. SATMC would now engage with the National Treasury and Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan on these and related issues.
